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# The Africa Union of Architects CPD Workshop

## BEYOND HOUSING

14th-16th June 2012, Libreville, Gabon



Within the defined Vision, the Africa Union of Architects has launched the first CPD (Continual Professional Development) for all the professionals of the built environment, with the topic : “Beyond Housing” : Housing for the mass.

This AUA CPD, launched with the assistance of the RIBA is one of the two important achievements of the MoU signed with the RIBA and the UIA (under Gaetan Siew’s Presidency). The other achievement, the AUACC, adopts the UIA/UNESCO guidelines on Competitions.

**This first CPD edition’s objective is federating studies and implementation tools, as well as generating specific solutions for the improvement of our built and life environment in Africa.**

The approach has been defining a platform that will be moving throughout the five regions of Africa, make the Center Region the first one, in Gabon.

This program, held in Libreville from the 14th to the 16th of June 2012, has allowed the creation of a platform of work with prestigious partners, as can be UN-Habitat.

**This CPD concluded indeed on defining the specific paradigms regarding Africa’s conditions (economical – urban – social) and way of life, as well as its specific needs**, defining also a specific approach on the mass Housing question. The conclusion also defines the priorities and progressive actions needed in this sense, **and creates synergies with other policies developed**, and especially, those developed by UN-Habitat.

The outcomes of this first edition has open perspectives and define the theme of the next CPD meeting and studies, that will hold in Abidjan, Ivory Coast in December 2012, engaging the next step of this dynamic in the West region of Africa on the topic of “Transforming the human settlements”.

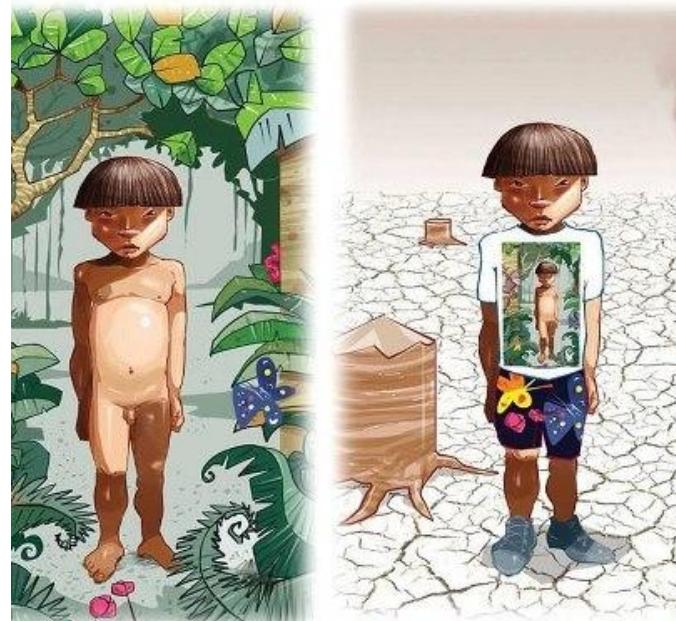
## Principle 3 : Culture as a way to define oneself – giving a meaning

*Meaning : giving a meaning to that identity, giving attention to it, to the empowerment we want from it.*



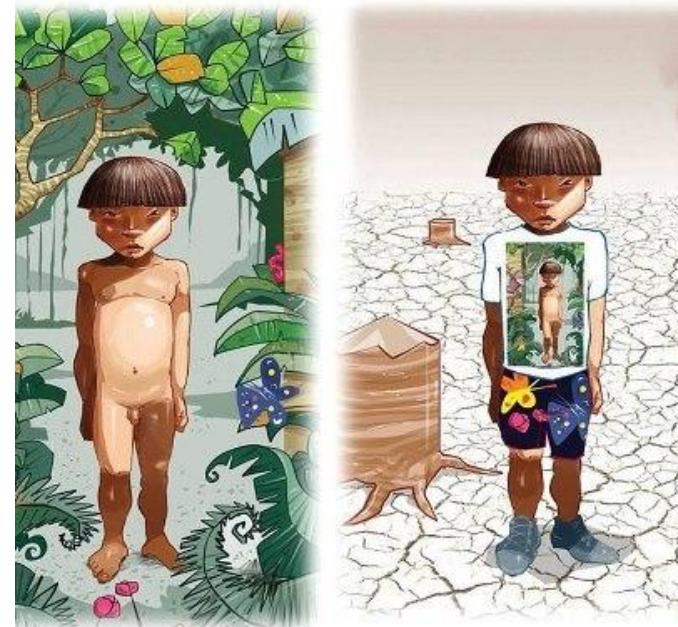
